Jsin Graham is a storyteller whose origin goes back to age six when he produced a two-page story on an assignment asking for a paragraph. As he grew his creative output moved from short stories to poetry in his formative years, transitioning briefly to songwriting, before coming back to where it all began, fiction writing.

Raised on the south side of Washington, D.C., Jsin considers himself a realistic optimist. He toes the line between being a dreamer and accepting the world for what it is, an experience to live and learn from. While this life view drives the words he puts down on the page, unbeknownst to him, in 2014, it would create the *what next* moment, that laid the foundation for his current endeavors.

Following an anthology submission rejection, his then-writing partner urged him to create his own. Four years later, *Unacceptable Behavior: A Thirteen Story Introduction to Storytelling* (2018) was born. The project was an opening salvo for what was to come from Graham as an author—unfettered visual depictions of the Black experience with a little extra razzle-dazzle. Since then, he counts three standalone books and inclusion in a short story anthology to his growing list of published works.

The contemporary adult fiction and reluctant Black romance author presents his writing as real, unpredictable, sexy, and ever-changing. He aims to create stories drenched in familiarity and visual clarity, satisfying his need for the consumer to feel what he's saying.

When not writing, Graham spends his time reading, with his family, and collaborating with entrepreneurs creatively. With whatever time he has left over, he does his best to stay out of the way.
